



Ecology Researcher

Location: Carbonear Campus

Temporary, Full-Time

Duties: Under the supervision of the Research Coordinator, the Ecology Researcher will provide services on a research project involving bee pollination of cranberry. The successful candidate will be responsible for the day-to-day management of the project. Duties include but are not limited to: determining acceptable field sites; implementing sampling protocols; field data collection; data compilation and analysis; literature searches; insect (bees) identification and curating of specimens; construction of insect sampling apparatus. Responsibilities also include operating and maintaining scientific instruments in support of the research activities; liaising between project and cranberry farmers; supervising and assisting students; and other duties as assigned by the Research Coordinator.

Qualifications: The successful incumbent must have project management experience in ecological studies. S/he must possess a working knowledge of ecological research methodology, especially in regard to insect sampling, curation and identification. These qualifications would normally be acquired through the completion of a Bachelor of Science in Biology (ecology and entomology focus). Candidates must possess strong field skills and the ability to effectively collect data in agricultural and remote settings; and should have strong problem-solving skills, organizational, communication (written and oral), interpersonal and teamwork skills, plus the ability to work independently. Candidates must possess a valid driver's licence. A MSc degree in ecology/entomology would be considered a definite asset.
