Her numerous awards and honours include the Pew Fellowship in Marine Conservation (2000); named Leader for the 21st Century by TIME Magazine (1999); the Rolex Award for Enterprise (1998); and the Grand Prix International pour l'Environnement Marin (1998) from the Confédération Mondiale des Activités Subaquatiques.
