CATTLE

Mycoplasma bovis causes pneumonia, polyarthritis, mastitis, and otitis media in cattle in Ontario

Neospora remains the leading cause of abortion in our cattle abortion survey, 1993-2001

The proportion of **BVDV** type 2 isolates has increased over the past 3 years

POULTRY

Salinomycin caused skeletal myopathy and significant mortality in a flock of young turkeys

Nephropathogenic infectious bronchitis virus has caused problems in Ontario broilers and layers

SWINE

We identified an infectious cause in 39% of the **porcine abortion** cases in the last 4 yrs

Ascarids must continue to be ruled out in cases of pneumonia

SMALL RUMINANTS

We detected a wide spectrum of diseases in our survey of sheep pathology diagnoses

HORSES

A farmer was killed by his unvaccinated **rabid horse**

EHV-1 is still the leading cause of equine abortion

COMPANION ANIMALS

Calicivirus, Mycoplasma felis, and bacterial infection caused fatal pneumonia in kittens

Feline infectious peritonitis occurs in young kittens as well as in older cats
