CATTLE

Accidental ingestion of sulfur caused rumenitis and unusual hepatic necrosis

POULTRY

We are now offering a new molecular test for detection and genotyping of infectious bronchitis virus (IBV)

SWINE

<u>Haemophilus parasuis</u> causes septicemia, sudden death, pneumonia, and polyserositis/arthritis in pigs of all ages

Current respiratory disease outbreaks in lambs and kids appear to be of viral origin

HORSES

West Nile virus infection is now a primary rule-out for encephalitis in horses

A **botulism outbreak** occurred in a large group of horses fed baylage

COMPANION ANIMALS

Canadian pennies, 1997-2001, can cause zinc poisoning

Overheated PTFE can cause sudden death in pet birds

We are able to detect significant underlying disease in the minority of cases of anesthetic-related deaths in dogs and cats
