## "Digging and Dignification: The New Idiom of Spanish Cultural Memory"



Alison Ribeiro de Menezes read Spanish and French at St Anne's College, Oxford, completing a DPhil in Spanish in 1997. In 1995 she joined the Department of Spanish at University College Dublin, specializing in modern Spanish literature and culture. She has also taught Portuguese and Latin American narrative and prose of the Spanish Golden-Age. She has published widely on contemporary Spanish narrative, including the books *Juan Goytisolo: The Author as Dissident* (Tamesis, 2005), and *A Companion to Carmen Martín Gaite,* co-authored with Catherine O'Leary (Tamesis, 2008). Her current research focses on issues of cultural memory in the Hispanic and Lusophone worlds, and she has co-edited two volumes in this area: *War and Memory in Contemporary Spain/Guerra y memoria en la España contemporánea* with Roberta Quance and Anne Walsh (Verbum, 2009), and more recently *Legacies of War and Dictarorship in Contemporary Portugal and Spain,* with Catherine O'Leary (Peter Lang, 2011).
