Andrea Zannini teaches Modern History at the University of Udine. He has published widely on the social history of Venice in the modern age. Among his books are: *Burocrazia e burocrati a Venezia in età moderna: i cittadini originari (sec. XVI-XVIII)* (1993) [*Public Administration and Civil Servants in Venice in the Modern Age: Venetian Citizens from the XVI to the XVIII century*]; *Il sistema di revisione contabile della Serenissima. Istituzioni, personale, procedure (sec. XVI-XVIII)* (1994) [*The Serenissima's Accounting Review System. Institutions, Personnel, Procedures, from the XVI to the XVIII century*]; *Venezia città aperta. Gli stranieri e la Serenissima XIV-XVIII sec.* (2009) [*Venice Open City. Foreigners and the Serenissima from the XIV to the XVIII century*]. He has also published on historical demographic trends in Alpine areas, on the history of universities in Europe, on migration between the Veneto region and Brazil. His most recent books is *Storia minima d'Europa. Dal Neolitico a oggi* (2015) [*A Very Brief History of Europe from the Neolithic Age to the Present*].
