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## Brief Course Synopsis:

## Theories of the Self: Power and Resistance from Sigmund Freud to Judith Butler

This course guides students through a range of theoretical models and approaches to understanding subjectivity and explores their implications for readings of a limited number of cultural productions. The seminar's main areas of concentration are: (1) close reading and critical analysis, focusing on the way a particular film *Fight Club* (1999) works in its details and structure; (2) theoretical approaches and models of subject formation, including readings that cover Psychoanalysis, Marxism, Poststructuralism, Critical Race Studies, Gender and Queer theory; and (3) essay writing and oral communication skills. This course is both writing and presentation intensive.
