Brief Course Synopsis:

English 2080 serves as an immediate follow-up to English 1080, and offers opportunities for extra development of close reading skill of literary texts, but it also aims to supplement these skills with a reading of selected critical essays. Students will have a chance to read specific works of contemporary criticism and measure their own critical thinking against those of peer-reviewed, published scholars.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

Close Reading Assignment I 10% (250 - 500 words)Close Reading Assignment II 15% (250 - 500 words)Essay Analysis 15% (250 - 500 words)

Seminar Presentation 5%

The TAs run the seminars from beginning to end. You attend and participate; you may be

asked to give brief presentations.

Short Paper 4 – 6 pages 25% (1500 – 2000 words)
