I. B.A.Program Requirements

1. Distribution requirement. The distribution requirement of8courses (4.0 credits) is as follow ${ }^{\sim}$ :
a) 3 courses ( 1.5 credits) from at least two different subject areas in the College of Arts

Note: Students should have completed requirements a) and b) by the end of semester 3. Requirement c) need not be completed immediately but is a graduation requirement.
II. Not more than 12 courses (6 credits) at the 1000 level including those listed above.

## DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

General Program $=30$ courses ( 15 credits) including at least 8 courses ( 4 credits) at the 3000 level or above. 18 courses ( 9 credits) must be from the College of Arts, Social Science subject areas as above, the Department of Computing and Information Science or the Department of Mathematics and Statistics.

Honours Program $=40$ courses ( 20 credits) including at least 14 courses ( 7 credits) at the 3000 level or above: $\left({ }^{* *}\right)$ and including at least 1 major. Obtain a cumulative average of $70 \%$ for all course attempts at the University of Guelph in at least one Major Honours subject studied. Not more than 28 courses ( 14 credits) can be taken in anyone subject or discipline indicated by the course prefix code.

Specific courses waived (such as Fren 1200 \& Fren 2030) must be replaced by elective French Courses, so that the total number of courses required is completed. Students are encouraged to plan ahead very carefully, as some courses are offered only in alternate years. FREN*1090, FREN*1100, FREN*1120, FREN*1150, are not counted toward a specialization in French.
