This course offers individual instruction in the technical and aesthetic aspects of music composition. In order to register for this course, students must submit a portfolio and arrange for an interview with the School of Fine Arts and Music at the time of course selection.

Prerequisite(s): MUSC*2180

Restriction(s): Instructor consent and registration in a Music Program (Honours Major or Minor, General).

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Students will have the opportunity to apply skills learned in the core of the music program to creative musical activity, focused on the writing of scores and/or the production of electroacoustic studio works. Students will work on compositional activities appropriate to their level of experience and creative goals. Composition assignments will be completed and presented biweekly. There will be three individual or small group meetings with the instructor during the semester. To support this creative work, students will study scores and recordings of a cross section of relevant literature. Students will be expected to gain some ability to articulate formal design and musical/cultural contexts as these apply to their creative work. In addition, students will engage in detailed study of music notation, instrumentation, and orchestration. Students will regularly perform in each other's compositions, therefore attendance in class is critical.
