## Description

The Ensemble Project is a practice-based course in which students consolidate their learning the Theatre Studies Project by mounting a production (or productions.) As a group, we will collectively decide on how the production(s) will be created: through a script or through devising. However the production is created, the process will have a research component.

Working collaboratively is an important life-skill which is applicable in many contexts, including theatre. As part of an ensemble, you are expected to be respectful others. If there are problems which require solving, or disagreements which require resolutions, the expectation is that you will be patient, listen to other perspectives and behave in a courteous manner. Respect includes be prompt for classes and rehearsals, and arriving prepared to engage in the work for that day.

This course will result in public performances on Friday March 23, Saturday 24 and Sunday 25. Tech will be from Sunday March 18 until Thursday March 22. Regardless of your role in the production, you are expected to be available for the entire week.
