CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

This course offers an ethnomusicological introduction to the musical life of Sub-Saharan Africa, India, South America, the Middle East, Indonesia, and the Far East.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an introduction to the ethnomusicological study of some of the major musical cultures of the world. We will be examining the relationships between sounds, behaviours, and concepts found in each area. Some of the topics we will cover include the function of music in society, how music is created, the relationships between music, identity and other domains of culture, how and why music changes, and what and how music means.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:-

- -Recognize and describe musical styles of the musical cultures discussed in class.
- -Discuss and describe the various relationships between music and culture as they relate to social identity, transmission, agency, change, and social structure.
