Brief course Synopsis:		
A seminar course devoted to three of Plato's most important dialogues on ethics: the <i>Protagoras</i> , <i>Meno</i> , and <i>Philebus</i> . The <i>Protagoras</i> and <i>Meno</i> both explore the nature of virtue, but in different and complementary ways. The <i>Protagoras</i> investigates, for example, whether virtue as a whole is something simple or complex, while the <i>Meno</i> investigates the relation between virtue and knowledge. The <i>Philebus</i> , one of Plato's last dialogues, is concerned with the respective contributions of hedonism and rationality to happiness.		
<u>Course requirements:</u> The number and type of assignments will depend on enrolment, but ideally students will give two seminars each.
