Imperialism, Colonialism and the Communists in Palestine, 1919-1924

A lecture by Dr. Amír Locker-Bíletzkí

The history of Palestine in the years after World War One was shaped by British imperial domination, Zionist settler-colonialism and Palestinian resistance to it. *Imperialism, Colonialism and the Communist in Palestine,* outlines a theoretical frame in order to understand the way Communists in Palestine understood ideologically and politically acted against imperialism and settler colonialism. Dr. Locker-Bilezki argues that the Communists view, shaped as it was by Leninist concepts of imperialism, could not ideologically comprehend and politically combat Zionist settler-colonialism. Dr. Locker-Bilezki will discuss the way Communist ideology was played out in the historical reality of mid 1920s Palestine; as the 1924 Afula affair will be reconstructed using historical sources analysis.
