**Brief Description of Course:** The purpose of this course is to ensure that the student has a clear understanding of the context, scope and intention of Kant's epistemology and metaphysics. For the first two weeks we shall discuss the historical background and intellectual context, and over the next five weeks we shall work through the First Critique (the *Critique of Pure Reason* [KrV]). The remaining five weeks will be devoted to the Third Critique (the *Critique of the Power of Judgement* [CPJ]).

**Method of Evaluation:** The student's final mark for the course will be based upon one mid-term exam (40%) and a final exam (60%).

- (1) The midterm exam will be in-class and will be held **Thursday 13 February**. It will cover all of the material dealt with in class up to and including the Analytic of Concepts (but not the Analytic of Principles).
- (2) The final exam will be take-home and will be due **Wednesday 9 April**. It will cover the Analytic of Principles and the Transcendental Dialectic of the *Critique of Pure Reason* and the entire *Critique of the Power of Judgment*.
