

INTRODUCTION

From 1867 to 1930, Ontario rural society underwent profound changes as it emerged from the pioneer era into the machine age, while still retaining its rural orientations. Some might argue that this was a transitional period, an era when Ontario farming was evolving from a way of life, into a business venture. The general-topic agricultural periodicals published in Ontario between 1867 and 1930 chronicled the changes.

These periodicals were designed to appeal to a wide rural audience ("something for everyone in the family"), and as such are a rich source for the investigation of this era. The publications detailed the rise of many agricultural industries such as dairying and livestock production and breeding; the interest in and later implementation of scientific farming techniques; the increased awareness of the power of marketing; the growing participation in political and agricultural organizations; and the influence of the Ontario Agricultural College in nearly every facet of rural life. The technological, political and economic components of rural society were examined as well as the stresses in the community: industrialization, mechanization, encroaching urbanization, World War I, rural depopulation and absence of farm labour. The publications also explored contemporary movements in rural education, beautification, recreation and values, as well as advances in communications, the changing role of rural women, the country church, the agricultural press, and the personalities behind these events and movements.

The ten Ontario periodicals covered in this index (see page 6 for list) were chosen because they originally appealed to a wide audience of rural readers and thus providing a broad spectrum of rural topics. for researchers

today. Specialized technical journals (such as <u>Clydesdale Quarterly</u> or the <u>Canadian Poultry Journal</u>) were not included in the index because of their narrower scope — in them we learn too much of the inner workings of the chicken or the cow and too little of Ontario rural society.

Although these periodicals were meant for a general audience, they did differ in emphasis. For example, the five journals which comprised the Earm and Dairy series were heavily weighted towards the dairy industry. Farmer's Magazine (Maclean Publishing Co.) was a bit slicker, full of "think pieces" on the economic condition of rural Ontario, the impact of hydro development, and a greater emphasis on fiction and poetry by contemporary authors and poets. Rural Canada was more political than the others, almost appearing left of centre when compared with the staid pages of The Farmer's Advocate or The <u>Canadian Countryman</u>. These two periodicals, with the addition of the pre-1900 Canada_Farmer and Ontario_Farmer, were the most general of the group and did not highlight one aspect of Ontario agriculture to the determent of any other aspects. The Agricultural Gazette of Canada was published by the Canada Department of Agriculture under a provision of the Agricultural Instruction Act. This act was introduced to promote agricultural instruction in extension work as well as in the nation's primary and secondary schools. The <u>Gazette</u> was designed to be a forum for provincial and federal spokespersons to report on the work accomplished, to share ideas, and to promote further agricultural education. The Ontario Agricultural College Review, run by an editorial board of students, reflected the College's leadership in the many phases of Canadian agriculture. However, the Review not only reported the latest agricultural and horticultural studies at the OAC and elsewhere, it also featured items on OAC life -- from the debating club to Macdonald Hall.

Often the format of these periodicals consisted of the major topics first (livestock, economics, the feature article of the issue, etc.), followed by news about implements, editorials, proceedings of agricultural society meetings, information on household items, fiction, clothing features, children's columns, speciality departments (such as veterinary or investment), question and answer departments, weekly market quotations, and advertisements. Many of the pre-1910 issues were composed of massive reprints from a wide selection of Canadian, British and American journals, articles and editorials written by the editor, and letters from Ontario farmers offering opinions on every conceivable subject. Often small controversies would be fermented through subscribers' letters. Issue after issue, farmers might argue over the most economical and productive orchard cover crops, or whether bachelors should pay more tax than married men. There was a distinct sense in all the publications of a need and desire to help farmers interpret and utilize the new developments in their profession, and to aid the rural community during this period of adjustment. This index is organized to facilitate access into these diverse topics.

How to use the index

The index is organized into two main sections: the subject index and the author index. The subject index is divided into three parts: The Land, The People, and Organizations and Institutions. The entries are listed under each subject category in chronological order. Some article titles may have been shortened by the limitation of the computer character fields. Each entry consists of title, author, and publishing data. Please refer to the subject headings (see page 7 for list) to facilitate finding locations of subjects on

the microfiche.

In the alphabetical author index each entry is complete, that is, the title and publishing data are also included. It is to be noted that names appear as originally printed in the journals, thus the same individual may have written under various names, such as Doe, John W, or Doe, JW, or JWD, or even a pseudonym. The subject index and the author index are each on differently colour-headed microfiches.

Exclusions

The items excluded were those focussed outside Ontario, reprints from other journals and articles too short to be informative: for example, household hints, recipes, clothes patterns, children's pages, question-and-answer columns, and advertisements. Their inclusion would have added thousands of entries to this already large index without adding much usuable information. When the subject matter warranted it, articles were listed under more than one heading.
