- 30% 3 graded writing assignments (10% each), chosen from take-home assignments class exercises (up to 500 words each)
- **25% Class Participation**, including attendance, class discussion, break out group discussions, and in-class exercises.
- **25% Final Portfolio**, including:
  - 10% Revision of one of the workshopped take-home assignments or in-class exercise after receiving feedback/grade.
  - 10% Self-Reflection on your writing process/development through the semester
