## Brief Course Synopsis:

Fiction has many modes beyond the realistic. In this course we will engage with fiction as a mode for creating expanded imaginaries. Students will gain skills in a variety of writing techniques that develop their ability to enter fiction's speculative modes. We will consider how fiction is a means of world creation, including the futuristic, fantastic and dystopic. We will explore fiction as a mode for entering the perspectives of others, sometimes those radically not like us, including more-than-human beings, with implications for our storytelling, empathetic and ethical capacities. Our stories will ultimately offer us new ways of navigating our own world, our place within it and our interconnected relationships to others.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

Grade will be comprised of: completed writing exercises, evaluated writing assignments, written workshop commentary and self-reflection, final revision, and class participation. Details and weights, TBA.
