Brief Course Synopsis:

This course will focus on the working life of the freelance writer of non-fiction in the Canadian context both through reading assignments and by practising some of the most common freelance forms, such as the book review, the opinion column, the personal essay and the research feature article. The course will emphasize that the freelance writer is first of all a reader and processor of insights and information; among the subjects discussed will be the tension, exacerbated by economic and social trends, between researched non-fiction and personal memoir.
