Brief Course Synopsis:

Writers in the World is a reading-and discussion-based course that involves students in significant, often highly contentious debates about the role of writing in the world—debates that form a context within which the writer creates imaginative worlds. Topics to be considered include a consideration of what 'world' might be, questions of subjectivity and responsibility, relationship to land/place/language, the climate crisis, the nature of paying attention, issues of representation, appropriation, and the nature of the world that we choose to represent, and colonial and racialized imaginaries, and counter-imaginaries.
