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#### **Brief Course Synopsis:**

# Theories of the Self: Power and Resistance from Freud to Pixar

This course guides students through a range of critical approaches and explores their implications for readings of a limited number of creative texts. This seminar's main areas of concentration are (1) close readings, centering on the way the film *Fight Club* (1999) works in its details and overall structure; (2) core concepts in critical theory, which include the body of ideas and methods in psychoanalysis, Marxism, postructuralism, feminism, gender and queer theory; and (3) critical writing and discussion.
