Brief Course Synopsis:

This course offers an overview of the practice of literary criticism through an introduction to literary theory. Students examine issues that develop from reading, interpretation, and evaluation of primary fictional and theoretical texts. Critical responses engage the assumptions and methodological implications of theoretically informed approaches (e.g., New Criticism, Marxist, Freudian, etc.) to literary criticism.

The course design includes a beginning module on Indigenous texts, a second module applying literary theory to *Hamlet* and *Frankenstein*, and a third module interpreting literary adaptations of *Hamlet* and *Frankenstein* by Ian McEwan.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

Essay 1 (750 words) 10%

Essay 2 (1000 words) 15%

Seminar 20%

Essay 3 5% introduction, thesis and bibliography (350 words) and 20% essay (1500 words)

Midterm Exam 15%

Final Exam 15%
