Brief Course Synopsis: This course looks at the relations, both harmonious and strained, between law and literature as they deal with such topics as justice, the rule of law, natural law, property, contracts, fundamental justice, evidence, cruel and unusual punishment, censorship, and extrajudicial action. We will consult a wide range of texts—short stories, novels, fairy tales, songs, films, plays, non-fiction; among the larger works we will look at are *The Handmaid's Tale*, *Fear and Misery in the Third Reich*, *Twelve Years a Slave*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, *Gross Indecency*, and *Measure for Measure*.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

3 short essays of 1,000 words each, 20% X 3
Participation in online discussions, 10%
Take-Home exam, 30%
