#### Brief Course Synopsis:

This course focuses on the relationship between performance and culture in late eighteenth-century Britain (1750-1820). We will be reading a wide range of plays and two novels in which performance is a key concern. We will be exploring matters of celebrity, sociability, ethnic and racial performance, and the highly volatile enactment of gender and sexuality. As we will see the very definition of Britishness and the notion of securing a cultural patrimony during a period of geopolitical upheaval are consistently at stake so we will be paying attention to how national and imperial fantasies are articulated and managed in real time.
