## Brief Course Synopsis:

We will conduct research in the nineteenth-century periodical archive, focusing on two clusters of texts: nineteenth-century Black North American newspapers, particularly those connected to Ontario, and nineteenth-century British periodicals that provide traces of Pacific Islander and Black people on the British evangelical lecture circuit. Our secondary reading will address the periodical as a genre, the challenges of tracing marginalized voices in the periodical archive, and the claiming of public space through print. Alongside this, we will read a fictional version of the work we have been doing with periodicals—Kai Thomas's *In the Upper Country* (2023)—which positions its reader as an archivist who links together narrative fragments from the past in order to trace the history of an individual, a family, and the interactions of Black and Indigenous peoples of North America.
