Brief Course Synopsis: This seminar explores fiction and non-fiction accounts of terrorism from the French Revolution to after 11 September. Various trajectories include 1880s-1920s (Russian) anarchism and 1960s-80s left-wing (Western and nationalist) terrorism, as well as post 9/11 fiction that foregrounds global, historical, and cultural context.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight: Essay 1 Close Reading (1500 words) 15% Literature Review and Thesis paragraph for Essay 2 (500 words) 10% Essay 2 (2500 words) 25% Discussion Board (best 2 out of 3 postings on CourseLink, 5% each) 10% Two Class Presentations 40%
