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Brief Course Synopsis: Through a range of literatures and film, this seminar explores fiction and non-fiction accounts of terrorist insurgency from the French Revolution to after 11 September. Various trajectories include 1880s-1920s (Russian) anarchism and 1960s-80s leftwing (revolutionary and nationalist) terrorism. The relationship between nationalism, colonialism and decolonizing insurgency will be foregrounded through discussion of such texts as Claire Messud's "The Professor's History," Ghassan Kanafani's "Returning to Haifa," Pierre Falardeau's *Octobre* and Deepa Mehta's adaptation of Shyam Selvadurai's *Funny Boy*, amongst others. The course emphasizes and critiques (though not exclusively) Western responses to terrorism in fiction and film. The end of the course conceptualizes postcolonialism intersectionally through interpreting Colum McCann's multiperspective biofiction, *TransAtlantic*.
