COURSE OUTLINE

Prerequisite: none.

Course objectives:

- 1.to introduce students to the language of Classical Greece, in particular to the basic principles of grammar and syntax in an inflected language
- 2.to provide a basic vocabulary for the reading of introductory Greek texts
- 3.to demonstrate that much of modern English vocabulary is derived from Greek
- 4.to introduce students to the culture that provides the foundation for Western civilization.
