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COURSE OUTLINE

Topic for Fall 2020: *Mexico Through the Short Novel*

Objectives: Mexico is characterized by its long, turbulent history, large population, complex cultural mix, and rich and varied Spanish vocabulary. Numerous Mexican writers, such as Carlos Fuentes, Fernando del Paso, Elena Poniatowska and Jorge Volpi have responded to these realities by writing very long novels. This course will look at writers who have adopted the opposite tactic by attempting to distill Mexican experience into short novels of fewer than 200 –and sometimes fewer than 150—pages. By studying these novels, in particular the literary and aesthetic choices they make, we will trace Mexican life, thought and imagination from the Mexican Revolution of 1910-1920 to the Narco Wars of the 2010s

Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Interpret, evaluate and criticize texts of different genres by important Mexican writers from the 20th or early 21st centuries: **Literacy**.
- Formulate a position and build an argument supported by appropriate evidence in the text: **Critical and Creative Thinking**.
- Increase artistic and intellectual appreciation of Latin American literature, Mexican literary and cultural tradition, and the trajectory of Mexican history: **Global Understanding**.
- Improve reading skills in Spanish, in addition to speaking skills: **Communicating**.

Method of Teaching: Synchronous “in-class” discussion on Teams.

Method of Evaluation:

5-page literary analyses (2 x 15%).....	30%
8-page comparative paper.....	20%
Reading quizzes (6 x 5%).....	30%
Quality of class participation.....	15%
In-class presentation.....	5%
