In this research talk Dr. Nighman will argue that the chamber above the chapterhouse at Inchcolm Abbey has been misinterpreted for nearly a century as a warming room (calefactorium), when in fact there is much evidence that contradicts that theory and supports the older tradition that it was actually the Abbey's library and scriptorium where Walter Bower composed his Scotichronicon.
