Brief Course Synopsis:

This is a course in writing for Performance, particularly playwrighting or screenwriting. The students will be expected to participate in discussion and share their writing and process with the class. Each class will be dedicated to a different aspect of the writing process, i.e., concept, characters, narrative arc, dialogue, tragedy/comedy, monologues, and scene work. Each student will be required to present a seminar on a Canadian playwright.

In the final class, students will present five minutes from their work to an invited audience.

Monologue: 10% Outline: 10% First 3 scenes: 10% First Draft: 20% Final performance: 10% Participation: 20% Seminar: 20%
