Brief Course Synopsis:

This course enhances undergraduate students evolving research skills from THST 1270 by taking them through a variety of ways to collect, assess, and use theatrical research data. The epistemology of theatre studies—thinking about how we know what we can know—will be forefront in all seminar discussion and assignments in this course. Emphasis will also be placed on improving writing skills and broadening student comprehension of theatre studies terminology in practice. Topics covered will include archival and database research, interviewing skills, ethics, conference presentations, research funding opportunities, assessing unconventional data, empirical research, conceptual theatre theory, and research methods for creative projects. This undergraduate seminar requires reading assigned materials, doing extra research at home, participating in-class discussions, and working on a consistent research project throughout the term. Students will discuss and select research topics early in the term, which will allow for all submitted assignments to form part of their emerging final research paper project. A proactive and serious attitude towards theatre studies research will be expected.
