Brief Course Synopsis:				
This semester we will undertake a critical examination of works of contemporary cinema from				
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a range of national cinemas, including the US, Britain, Israel, Palestine, Kenya and Chile. We will also examine the role of film comedy as entertainment and as a vehicle for social commentary. Although our primary emphasis will be on 21<sup>st</sup> century cinema, we will give some consideration to the historical, political and cultural contexts that have shaped contemporary cinema. This semester we will briefly spotlight contemporary African-American filmmakers and will look at how a number of contemporary filmmakers explore issues of race, class and gender. The vitality of contemporary pop culture writing about contemporary cinema will also be examined.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

Midterm- 30% Film Review – 30% Final Exam (Take Home) – 40% Texts and/or Resources Required (e.g. Internet access, specific textbook title, lab kit, etc.)

Access to the internet will be required for this course as all of our reading and viewing will be via the internet.
