Brief Course Synopsis:

Carrianne Leung

This course focuses on techniques for creating compelling narratives, particularly in fiction. We will concentrate on the core components of stories, including scene, story arc, and point of view, strategies for creating tension and energy, and techniques for inhabiting character. Through short lectures, readings, in-class exercises and take-home assignments, discussion and peer workshops, students will develop their writing skills and learn how narrative can be a way to make meaning, pay attention to the world, and connect more deeply with others.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

Take-home writing assignments

- ten in total, 250-500 words, not graded: 20 percent

Three graded writing assignments, chosen from take-home assignments or in-class exercises

- (each up to 500 words): 10 percent each, totalling 30 percent

Class Participation:

including group discussion, paired and group workshops, in-class exercises: 25 percent

Final Portfolio:

- Revision of one of workshopped take-home assignments or in-class exercise after receiving feedback/grade (10 percent).
- Self-Reflection on your writing process/development through the semester (10 percent).
- Written response to one of the stories discussed in class this semester, focused on writing technique. (5 percent). 25 percent
