Brief Course Synopsis:

This final year capstone course provides theatre students with the opportunity to draw on their acquired knowledge, skills, and values learned throughout their program of study. Ensemble Project allows students to form a theatre company, explore all aspects of the creative & production processes, and mount a full scale theatre production of their choosing. Students in this course will work as a large group (with individually assigned roles) to create and stage their final performance in Theatre Studies at the end of March 2023. This course will require 4-6 hours a week of collaborative labs/rehearsals outside class times from all students and attendance at all technical rehearsals and performances.

Methods of Evaluation and Weight:

- 1. Scheduling and Production Planning: 15%
- 2. Progress Mid-term production and rehearsal work: 25%
- 3. THST 2190 Mentoring: 20%
- 4. Progress Final Rehearsal Process, Tech Week, Dress Rehearsal, Show Week Involvement: 25%
- 5. Production Journals-15%
