Detailed Course Description:

Emphasis will be on the application of concepts and algorithms in AI to simple practical problems in the areas of planning, games and learning. Assignments will be very challenging, but students will be provided with lots of guidance to help them to succeed.

A typical assignment will consist of 3 parts. Part I will involve programming and Intelligent Systems. Part II will involve and analysis of the software from Part I applied to one or more specific problems (this includes running experiments, documenting results). Part III will involve a discussion of the observations from Part II and relating these observations back to theoretical and mathematical expectations related to the techniques used, and also a speculative component discussing what could be done next.
