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Welcome to the first official edition of the CANPOLIN newsletter! Since receiving word last fall that the CANPOLIN proposal was successful, we have been making great strides towards getting the Network up and running. This newsletter provides a brief update on some of the activities currently taking place in the network. More detailed newsletters will follow on a regular basis as additional information becomes available.

Report on the SAC Meeting and Workshop

A workshop and Science Advisory Committee (SAC) meeting was held January 19th and 20th at the University of Guelph. The meetings were held to address some of the concerns identified in the CANPOLIN proposal by NSERC's reviewers and to begin planning and budgeting for Year 1 and Year 2 activities. The workshop was attended by a number of CANPOLIN researchers outside the SAC who brought additional insights and expertise into the planning process. Working Group leaders are now busy planning more detailed budgets and plans for Year 1. These budgets will be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

Key outcomes of the workshop and SAC meeting include the following:

- 1) As per the recommendations of the NSERC review, Working Group 6 (Floral Biology) will be incorporated into other working groups.
- 2) NSERC is recommending that CANPOLIN raise \$200k in cash per year to help meet the needs of the Network. CANPOLIN is asking that all researchers be aware of possible sources of funds, particularly those involved in industry-relevant projects that can be used to leverage cash support.
- 3) The Network will bring in an additional post-doc in Working Group 8 (Economics) to help steer integration between the economics and biological research. This was a need identified by both NSERC reviewers and the SAC.
- 4) A post-doc to be shared by WG5 (Ecosystems) and WG7 (Prediction) will also be brought in to assist with integration and geomatics.
- 5) A **Databasing Committee** has been set up to identify an appropriate database for CANPOLIN's needs and to standardize the type of insect and plant data that needs to be collected.
- 6) Canola has been identified as a major crop of interest for sampling and ecosystem work.
- 7) Linkages to policy development early in the life of the Network will be important. The SAC will work to develop a plan to establish the appropriate linkages.

Inter-University Network Agreement

The Office of Research at the University of Guelph sent out the Inter-University Network Agreement on February 19. All universities will need to sign the agreement before money can be transferred to any CANPOLIN researchers. **We will need to provide a detailed budget to the universities before the agreement can be fully executed so time is of the essence in developing each working group's budget for Year 1.**
