

CBS Student Bursary International Collaborative Research: Application Form

The purpose of this award is to provide faculty with support to promote international training opportunities for our graduate students. These funds will be awarded to faculty on a competitive basis and are tied to fostering partnerships with our international partners and supporting the travel costs and living expenses for our graduate students while conducting research abroad.

The selection criteria for the CBS Student Bursary: (1) the quality of the graduate student being recruited, (2) the description of the training opportunity, (3) the manner in which the training enhances the partnership between the University of Guelph and the international institution (4) if applicable, evidence that the student being recruited represents incremental growth in graduate student numbers which would otherwise not have been possible, and (5) the financial need of the advisor(s).

Students are eligible to receive one bursary during their graduate program. If a CBS Student Bursary is granted and the student listed in the application does not enroll at Guelph, or, conduct research with the partnering institution, the award is rescinded. The maximum value of the contribution from the college will be \$5000 per application, based on the award being valued at 50% of the travel and living expenses for the training opportunity. Normally, an advisor may hold only one of these awards. An advisor would become eligible for a second award after a funded student had completed their international travel.

There are no application deadlines. Efforts will be made to adjudicate the applications on a monthly basis to assist in the recruitment of the new students.
