SUBMISSION DEADLINE: FEBRUARY 1

The fund is intended to incubate and provide start up support for innovative and engaged nutrition research related to education or knowledge mobilization. Knowledge mobilization is an umbrella term encompassing a wide range of activities relating to the production and use of research results, including knowledge synthesis, dissemination, transfer, exchange, and co-creation or co-production by researchers and knowledge users.

The 3-page application must be submitted to the CSAHS Research Advisory Committee, CSAHS Research and Graduate Studies Office at csahsadr@uoguelph.ca by February 1. Notifications will be sent by March 15.

Successful applicants must spend funds within 2 years, submitting a final research report six months after the end of the funding period. (Refer to call for proposals for additional information).

NOTE: Applicants may not hold a SSHRC Institutional Grant (Explore) and Seed Funding for the same project. Due to the timing of the funding competition results for SSHRC Insight Development Grant, applicants who are applying for the SSHRC Insight Development Grant must propose a substantially different Seed Funding project.

The College of Social and Applied Human Sciences has partnered with the J. Elizabeth Campbell Estate to establish the **James Alexander Campbell Nutrition Education and Knowledge Mobilization Fund** in support of scholarship investigating nutrition-related education and knowledge mobilization.

The fund is intended to incubate and provide start up support for innovative and engaged research related to nutrition education or knowledge mobilization. Knowledge mobilization is an umbrella term encompassing a wide range of activities relating to the production and use of research results, including knowledge synthesis, dissemination, transfer, exchange, and co-creation or co-production by researchers and knowledge users.

Eligibility:

The proposed project must focus on nutrition research related to education or knowledge mobilization.

The principal investigator of the proposed project must be a faculty member (permanent or contractually limited).

Preference will be given to projects that include collaborative partner(s) from either within or outside the University. This could include partners from other departments or colleges at the University of Guelph, from other universities, or community agencies or organizations.

The project must meet the usual requirements for approval by a Research Ethics Board.

The grant may serve as the total support for a project, or supplement an existing research effort, as long as a specific portion of the research is identified as being made possible by this grant, and provided that the investigator states specifically how the balance will be funded, providing evidence of its guaranteed availability. The grant must not duplicate funding for an existing research project.

Assessment:

Proposals will be received and adjudicated by a review committee, chaired by the CSAHS Associate Dean (Research) and will include faculty representatives from Applied Human Nutrition, Human Health and Nutritional Sciences, and Food Sciences.

Criteria for assessment include:

1. Demonstrated focus on nutrition research related to education or knowledge mobilization.
2. Inclusion of collaborative partners.
3. Sound methodology, including a detailed evaluation plan for knowledge mobilization activities, if proposed.

Process and Timelines:

All proposals must be submitted on the CSAHS application form, which can be accessed through the CSAHS research website (<https://www.uoguelph.ca/csahs/research/forms-guidelines>).

Applications are due Feb 1 to csahsadr@uoguelph.ca. Applicants will be notified of decisions by March 15.

Deliverables:

A final report must be submitted to the College within six months after the end of funding period in the form of a one-page summary. Outputs from this research funding, e.g., publications, toolkits, websites, must be made available for distribution through an Open Access platform. The **James Alexander Campbell Nutrition Education and Knowledge Mobilization Fund** should be acknowledged in all research outputs.

Funding and Duration of Support:

The **James Alexander Campbell Nutrition Education and Knowledge Mobilization Fund** will provide support to a maximum of \$20,000. Awards are not renewable. Projects must be completed within **two years of the confirmation of the award**.

NOTE: Applicants may not hold a SSHRC Institutional Grant (Explore) and Seed Funding for the same project. Due to the timing of the funding competition results for SSHRC Insight Development Grant, applicants who are applying for the SSHRC Insight Development Grant must propose a substantially different Seed Funding project.
