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University of Guelph Multi-year Accessibility Plan (2016-2021)

Accessibility at the University of Guelph

Through the fundamental dedication of our people, service units, and departments, and the strategic leadership of our accessibility committees, the University of Guelph either met or notably surpassed nearly all of the goals set out in our 2012-2015 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan.

This accomplishment demonstrates a sustained and wide ranging commitment towards improved accessibility for our students, staff, faculty and visitors across our campuses.

The newly developed capacities and goals reached over the last four years (outlined in the UofG 2012-2015 Multi-year Accessibility Plan) demonstrate that we are ideally positioned to become an even more accessible and inclusive place to study, work, and visit.

The following is the University of Guelph's preliminary Multi-year Accessibility Plan based on input from various accessibility committees. As wider input is solicited from the campus community, this document will be updated to reflect the feedback received.

Looking Ahead

The University of Guelph is required to comply with the following upcoming requirements under the Integrated Accessibility Standard Regulation (IASR) for 2016-2021. The Design of Public Spaces Standards, coming into effect by January 1, 2016, encompasses the following areas:

- Recreational trails and beach access routes
- Outdoor public use eating areas
- Outdoor play spaces
- Exterior paths of travel
- Parking
- Obtaining service
- Maintenance

Additional Information and Communication standards will come into effect by January 1, 2020, affecting the following areas:

- Producers of educational or training material
- Libraries of educational and training institutions

The standards for the Design of Public Spaces apply to large public organizations when constructing or redeveloping its public spaces.

In 2021, all Internet sites are to conform to WCAG 2.0 Level AA, except for live captions (success criteria 1.2.4) and audio descriptions (pre-recorded).
