

## Biological Spill Kit

- A simple spill kit should be readily available and include the following items:


### Contents of the Spill Kit

Concentrated disinfectant (For more information, refer to Module 3.2 Disinfectants in the Biosafety training courses)

### Absorbent pads and paper towels



Autoclaveable bag; Spill warning signage (could be computer printed or handmade)



### Dustpan and brush; forceps/tongs



### Gloves and booties

### Safety goggles and N-95



- All above contents should be placed in a tote or bin in clearly labelled and easily accessible space.
- Supplies should be checked regularly (e.g. monthly or quarterly)
- In the event of biohazard spill, inform PI/lab supervisor immediately.
  - Additionally, notify Biosafety Officer through completion of University of Guelph's [Incident reporting process](#) [1] (for exposure and/or near miss)
