

Graduate Research Position in Molecular Cancer Biology

An MSc or PhD graduate student position is available in the laboratory of Dr. Marc Coppolino, Department of Molecular and Cellular Biology, College of Biological Science at the University of Guelph. Starting in fall, 2018, the proposed research will investigate the molecular mechanisms that regulate cancer cell invasion and migration through the extracellular matrix (ECM) as part of the metastatic cascade.

Independent and self-motivated applicants with a background in cell biology, biochemistry, or molecular biology are encouraged to apply. Previous laboratory experience (e.g. 4th-year research project) is an asset. The successful candidate will join a dynamic research team studying fundamental aspects of cancer biology.
