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Presentations

The length of oral presentations will be 15 minutes including time for discussion. A PC projector (LCD projector) or an overhead projector is available for oral presentations.

All speakers using a PC projector should prepare an electronic file in Microsoft PowerPoint, and submit the file on a 650 MB CD-R to the reception desk before the day of the presentation.

No CD-RW and USB memory should be used. A Windows XP computer, installed with Microsoft PowerPoint 2003, will be set in each conference room. A computer of the same system will also be available in a computer room to allow speakers to preview their presentations. The presentation file must be named as "last name.ppt".

A panel of 90 cm in width and 180 cm in height will be provided for each presentation in the poster session.

Preparation of Abstracts

Abstracts are required for all presentations, either orally or as a poster. **Deadline for submission of abstract is 30 April 2006.** Abstracts can be submitted by e-mail (6icdrb@mbox.nc.kyushu-u.ac.jp) as an attachment in Microsoft Word (doc) or rich text format (rtf). Please name the file attachment with your last name and first initial.

Abstracts should comprise four paragraphs (Title, Authors, Abstract, and Key Words), laid out as in the following guidelines below. No figures should be included. For oral presentations, please underline the presenting author. When sending your abstract, please indicate if you would prefer the presentation an oral or a poster.
