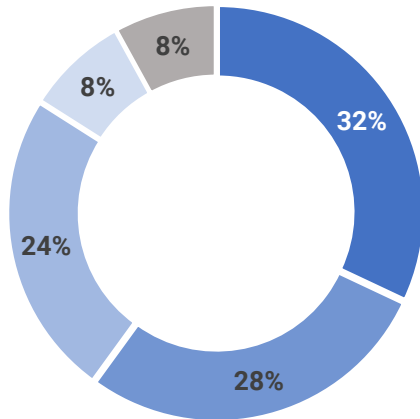
Job Titles of PhD graduates in the Not-for-Profit Sector in 2019-2019
