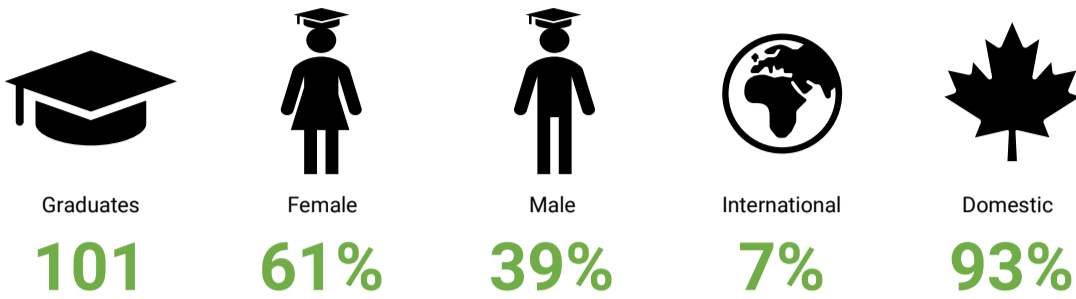


Degrees With a Difference

Sample employers of OAC master's in the Individual Sector



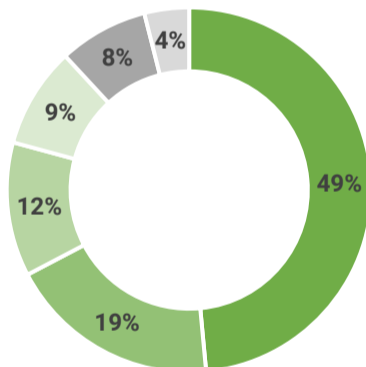

Job titles of master's graduates in the Individual Sector in 2018-2019.

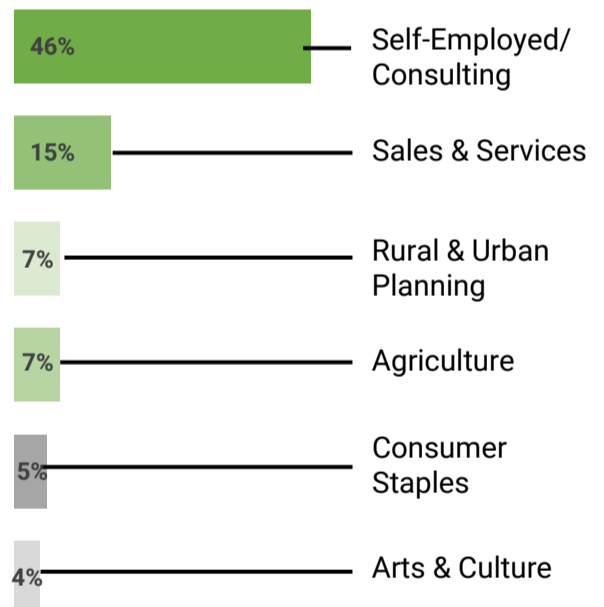


Academic Unit distribution for the Individual Sector
