- Make it easy to read consider a PDF file
- Avoid including high school activities \*
- Can include an 'Overview' section

### OVERVIEW

- Strong critical thinking, analytical expertise and honed research skills.
- Strong interpersonal skills, including the ability to work with a diverse range of individuals and handle sensitive information.
- Ability to create and deliver engaging, informative, well-organized presentations and reports.
- Effective in unstructured and demanding professional environments that encourage self-initiative, teamwork, problem-solving and creativity.

- Submit one application through online portal – indicate up to three schools where you intend to apply (your proposed host institutions)
- Due December 1, 2022

### Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS)

- Funded by government of Ontario
- \$15,000 per year
- Submit an application at each Ontario school you're applying to

   same application, but different schools may have different deadlines and processes
- Due January 31, 2023 (Guelph)

## What Goes Into the Application

### Canada Graduate Scholarship – Masters (CGS-M)

- Online application, which includes:
  - Research proposal (1 page)
  - Bibliography + citations
  - Identify field of research
  - Transcripts
  - Canadian Common CV (CCV)
  - Special circumstances (optional)
  - 2 Reference Letters

### Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS) - Guelph

- Application form, which includes:
  - Research proposal (1 page)
  - Bibliography + citations
  - Publications/Presentations
  - Academic accomplishments
  - List of scholarships/awards
  - Special circumstances (optional)
- 2 Reference Letters

# Selection Criteria: Research Proposal + CV

Canada Graduate Scholarship – Masters (CGS-M)

- Research Proposal:
  - Quality and feasibility
  - Communication and organization
  - Abilities and skills that will help you complete the project on time
- CCV:
  - Research experience and training
  - Leadership, volunteering, and community work

### Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS)

- Research proposal:
  - Motivation, creativity, significance, and communication skills (emphasize these things/use these words)
- Academic excellence in your transcripts, awards, publications/ presentations, and other accomplishments (like internships and volunteering)

## Writing the Research Proposal

- Carefully read the instructions and evaluation criteria
- Write in a clear, understandable way don't use jargon, define important terms that reviewers may not know
- Organize your ideas effectively you have a lot to cover in 1 page
  - General template: brief gripping paragraph, literature + theory review/gap in literature, your study overview/methods, hypotheses/ expected findings, impact + significance –but also emphasize skills/abilities that will help you complete the project
- Emphasize what makes your proposal original, how it will contribute to the field of study, and why it's important
- Take the time to write and edit, and get feedback from others if possible (great to get perspectives from those in a different field)



## Asking for Reference Letters

- Request letter from referees who know you well and who you know will provide a positive reference – ask if they can give you a strong reference
- Provide the referee with as much information as possible to help them write a strong letter – CV, research contributions, unofficial transcript, etc. and make sure to provide the appropriate form of link. The more tools you give referees to work with the better!
- Give them plenty of time one month+, not including holidays
- For form references, fill out every part of the form that you can (your personal info, their name, etc.)
  - If the letter must be mailed, provide an envelope with postage and address written in
