Membership is contingent upon continuing participation in the graduate program of the university and is subject to review. Associated graduate faculty may participate as co-advisors, serve on advisory committees, participate in graduate examinations and teach graduate courses. Individuals appointed by the university to teach a graduate course on a limited basis, serve on examining committees or are appointed to an advisory committee for a limited time are designated as special graduate faculty. The term of appointment is defined at the time of appointment.
