



In response to the Russian military invasion of Ukraine, the Government of Ontario established the Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship to support students attending Ontario's publicly assisted colleges and universities. The University of Guelph and University of Guelph-Humber will award four scholarships of \$10,000 to students who have been impacted by the conflict in Ukraine or other conflicts around the globe.

These scholarships will be awarded to four students who have demonstrated academic excellence and financial need. The application is open to domestic and international students who are studying on a part-time or full-time basis.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Registered in an undergraduate or graduate program in each of the fall and winter semesters at the University of Guelph or University of Guelph-Humber.
2. Living in Ontario during their study period.
3. Demonstrated financial need (as determined through the submission of a Financial Need Assessment Form).
4. Minimum 80.0% cumulative average.
5. Undergraduate students: completed a minimum of 4.0 credits at the time of application.
6. Graduate students: completed a minimum of three semesters at the time of application.

Value: 4 scholarships of \$10,000 each (payable in two equal payments in the fall and winter semesters)

The Ministry uses this personal information to administer the Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship program, which includes planning or delivering the program, allocating resources, evaluating, or monitoring the program, and detecting, monitoring and preventing fraud or any unauthorized receipts of services or benefits related to the program. If you are selected as the recipient of an Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship and you have applied for OSAP assistance, the Ministry will also use your personal information for the purposes of administering OSAP.
