Special Call for Tier 2 SSHRC CRC Applicants from Equity-Seeking Groups

The University of Guelph invites applications for nomination to a Tier 2 SSHRC Canada Research Chair in all fields of study identified in the University's <u>Strategic Research Plan</u>. Candidates must be tenure-track or tenured faculty members at the University of Guelph. Individuals who have a firm offer of employment to the University that takes effect by July 1, 2020 are also eligible.

To address the under-representation of members of equity-seeking groups among our Chairholders, this initiative follows the provisions for a **special program as described by the Ontario Human Rights Commission**. This opportunity is open only to exceptionally qualified individuals who selfidentify as members of one or more of the four federally designated groups: women, visible minorities/racialized persons, persons with a disability, or Indigenous Peoples. The identification of outstanding candidates from the designated groups is central to the University's commitment to excellence, as well as to its capacity to fulfill the objectives of the University's <u>Canada Research</u> <u>Chairs Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Action Plan</u>.

Tier 2 Chairs are for emerging scholars, and the successful nominee should be within ten years of receiving their PhD, or Highest Degree. To meet the **criteria of the program**, nominees must be excellent emerging world-class researchers who have demonstrated particular research creativity; have demonstrated the potential to achieve international recognition in their fields in the next five to ten years; as Chairholders, have the potential to attract, develop and retain excellent trainees, students and future researchers; and be proposing an original, innovative research program of high quality.

Applicants who are more than ten years from having earned their highest degree (and where career breaks exist, such as maternity, parental or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc.) may have their eligibility for a Tier 2 chair assessed through the program's **Tier 2 justification process**.

Applications should include 1) a two-page letter of interest describing qualifications and research plans for the position; and 2) a curriculum vitae. If you are more than ten years from having earned your highest degree, please include an explanation of why you feel you qualify for a justification, as described in the link above.

All materials should be submitted to <u>stratprg@uoguelph.ca</u> by June 17. The review of applications will be conducted by the University's <u>CRC Advisory Committee</u>. The final decision will be made by the Vice-President (Research) and the Provost.
