Funding Opportunity Description 2022 Exploration Competition









Program Description Exploration Stream Objective

<u>Goal</u>: Inspire research that is **high risk**, **high reward**, and **interdisciplinary**.

Support projects that:

- bring disciplines together beyond traditional disciplinary or common interdisciplinary approaches;
- propose to explore something new, which might fail; and
- have the potential for significant impact.



Range of impacts:

Social, cultural, economic, health-related, technological, etc.

<u>Proposals led from any discipline:</u> Social sciences and humanities, health, natural sciences and engineering.



Program Description Value and Duration

Value \rightarrow Up to \$125,000 per year (including indirect costs of up to 25% of direct costs).

Funds should be used primarily to support research activities, **not to acquire or maintain infrastructure**.*¹

*1 Tri-Agency Guide on Financial Administration

Duration \rightarrow Up to 2 years.

Number of grants \rightarrow Minimum of 100 grants.

A proportion of awards will be reserved for Early Career Researchers (ECRs).*2

 *2 Research interruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic are recognized as an eligible delay \rightarrow starting on March 1, 2020.

Eligibility and Roles 2022 Exploration Competition









Eligibility and Roles Project Team Eligibility

At least 2 participants:

 a nominated principal investigator (NPI) who is an <u>independent researcher</u> at an eligible institution

AND

 a co-principal investigator (co-PI), who must also be an <u>independent</u> <u>researcher</u>

OR

- a co-applicant (co-App), who may be a:
 - o researcher / professor →
 <u>independent researcher</u>; or
 - practitioner, policy-maker, educator, decision-maker, health-care administrator, Indigenous Elder, etc.



Eligibility and Roles Project Team Eligibility

NPIs, co-PIs and co-Apps:

- must not be affiliated with a government* or for-profit company; and
- can participate in only one Exploration stream application or grant at one time**.

*With some exceptions; please refer to our website.

For a proposal to be considered led by early career researchers (ECRs), **both the NPI and co-PI** (if applicable) must be ECRs.

Active Grants: Final Report submission by August 13 required to eligible for 2022 Competition

Review Process

Overview

Purpose:

 to identify the most meritorious applications to be recommended for funding by the multidisciplinary review panel

External Reviewers assess the application for its High Risk, High Reward and Feasibility

Five members of the Multidisciplinary Review Panel review the application for all criteria, along with the external reviews, to make funding recommendations

Consult the <u>Reviewer Manual</u> for more detail



Review Process **External Review**

External reviewers will provide comments on the proposed project according to **3 criteria**:

- High risk
- High reward
- Feasibility

This process is **double-anonymous** (i.e. the external reviewers are not provided information that identifies the research team and vice versa).

The external reviewers will be provided with the following sections:

- NOI Stage: Summary of the Proposal
- Full Application stage:
 - 1. EDI-RD section;
 - 2. research proposal;
 - 3. budget justification; and
 - 4. literature references.



Review Process **External Review**

To ensure anonymity:

- Do **not include any identifying information about the team members** (e.g., names, previous work, research groups, departments, institutions or organizations) in sections provided to the external reviewers.
- When referring to prior research, use non-identifying statements (e.g., "article was published," "research was conducted on," etc.)



Review Process Multidisciplinary Review Panel

Adjudication involves scoring according to the evaluation <u>matrices</u> for the selection criteria:

- 1. Equity, diversity and inclusion-RD (EDI-RD) (pass/fail);
- Interdisciplinarity / fit to program (pass/fail);
- 3. High risk: 40% of overall score;
- 4. High reward: 40% of overall score; et
- 5. Feasibility: 20% of overall score.

Each application will be adjudicated by 5 members

- 3 with similar area of research expertise
- 2 provide non-expert perspective

Members have access to all content from the NOI and Full application stages, in addition to the External Reviewers' reports

This is not a double-anonymous review










Program Description Interdisciplinarity / Fit to Program




Interdisciplinarity requirements:

- at least two different disciplines (as defined by the group-level classification of the Canada Research and Development Classification codes, <u>CRDC</u>); and
- the onus is on the applicant to explain the novelty of the interdisciplinary approach to justify the fit to program.



Program Description Interdisciplinarity / Fit to Program



Interdisciplinarity can be defined by elements such as, but not limited to:

- Novelty of the Perspective \rightarrow integrating two or more disciplines not commonly combined.
- Novelty of the Approach → application or adaptation of frameworks/tools/methods/ techniques from one discipline to solve a problem in another discipline.
- Project Design \rightarrow designed from an interdisciplinary perspective.

Subcriterion

• Fit to Program \rightarrow pushes the boundaries of what can be funded through the agencies.

Multidisciplinary versus Interdisciplinary Research

Multidisciplinary Teams

Each member operates as a part of a chain of responsibility



Interdisciplinary Teams

Individuals from different fields are expected to contribute ideas to the entire project stack



Members listen to and learn from others



Program Description Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in Research Practice (EDI-RP)

*referred to as EDI in previous Exploration competitions

EDI-RP is a core element of the NFRF program and is comprised of **3 key areas**:

- 1. team composition and recruitment processes;
- 2. training and development opportunities; and
- 3. inclusion.

For each of the three key areas above, applicants must explain:

- □ what actions they will take;
- $\hfill\square$ the outcomes expected; and
- □ the assessment planned.



Program Description Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in Research Practice (EDI-RP)

*referred to as EDI in previous Exploration competitions

Actions proposed are expected to:

- remove barriers; and
- provide opportunities for the meaningful integration of individuals from all groups, including the four designated groups (women, Indigenous peoples, members of visible minorities and persons with disabilities).





Review Process High Risk



High risk can be defined by elements such as, but not limited to:

- proposing unique directions;
- challenging current research paradigms;
- enhancing understanding of complex and challenging issues;
- bringing new disciplines together with different perspectives, to use novel approaches for solving existing problems; and/or
- developing or adapting frameworks, methods and techniques.



Review Process High Reward



High reward can be defined by elements such as, but not limited to:

- having an economic, scientific, artistic, cultural, technological or health impact;
- impacting and/or affecting large communities, or unique communities or subpopulations with the potential to provide lessons for other contexts;
- transforming and/or disrupting conventional thinking;
- resolving a longstanding issue or debate; and/or
- significantly advancing current knowledge, methods and/or technologies.



Program Description Feasibility

Feasibility considers elements such as the:

- research problem being addressed;
- knowledge, expertise and capacity of the research team;
- current research in the field;
- workplan and timeline;
- proposed approach, including EDI in research design (EDI-RD)* where appropriate;
- project's engagement and reciprocity with First Nations, Inuit and/or Metis peoples (for Indigenous research), where appropriate; and
- suitability of the research environment.

*referred to as GBA+ in previous Exploration competitions

Full Application Requirements
Deadline

Application deadline for submission to NFRF:

September 13, 2022 at 8:00pm EST

Check with your RGO, who may set an earlier internal deadline.

Note: for participants currently named on an active Exploration Grant; the Final report must be received by August 13, 2022, and approved by Full Application deadline



Participants and Suggested External Reviewers

- Additional members can be added e.g. co-PI (if one not already invited), co-Applicants and/or Collaborators (new members will need to complete Convergence profiles).
- Update the list of suggested or excluded external reviewers (a minimum of 3 from each primary research field)
 - Be mindful of **conflicts of interest**
 - Identify appropriate expertise; min of 3 experts from each primary research field.
 - Ability to review with confidence (including language).
 - Experts familiar with the various disciplinary approaches in the interdisciplinary project.
 - Consider diversity in your selection (Canadian and international; private, government and public sectors; gender; under-represented groups; established, mid- and earlycareer researchers)

Research Proposal

Maximum 4 pages

- Describe the project and address why it is:
 - Interdisciplinary
 - High Risk
 - High Reward
 - Feasible
 - Discuss the approaches to Indigenous Research and EDI-RD (if appropriate)

Do not include any information that could identify team members

- State the objectives
- Describe the project:
 - methodology and design
 - work plan and timeline



Full Application Requirements Biographical Information

Maximum 2 pages

- Provide an overview of the research team's knowledge, background and expertise
- Identify the anticipated contributions of each team member

- Explain how their contributions will be coordinated and integrated
- If self-identifying information is relevant, it may be included in this section only with the members' consent



Full Application Requirements Budget Justification

Maximum 1 page

- Provide a breakdown & explanation of the direct costs
 - provide sufficient information to assess appropriateness of requested resources
- Other resources can also be described, if necessary, e.g. funding, materials, equipment
- Breakdown of indirect costs is not required

Do not include information that could identify team members

Literature References

Maximum 5 pages

• List of references cited in the application



Instructions for Attachments

- All documents must be converted to Portable Document Format (PDF) before they can be attached to the application
- Be mindful of <u>formatting requirements</u> (page length, font size, margins, no personally identifying information, etc.)

• Applications that do not adhere to the requirements can be withdrawn



Full Application Requirements Finalizing the Application

- Review your application and submit it
- Accept the Terms and Conditions
 - Status will change to Received by Administrator
- If changes are needed ask your institution's RGO to return it to you

- RGO approves and submits to agency
 - Status will change to Received by Agency
 - No further changes can be made



Information for RGOs 2022 Exploration Competition









Information for RGOs **RGO Role**

RGOs can:

- view applications from NPIs at their institution (expired, in progress and submitted);
- return submitted applications to the NPI; and
- forward submitted applications to the agency.

Before forwarding an application to the agency, you will be asked to confirm:

- that the participants meet the eligibility requirements; and
- that the proposed research project meets the eligibility requirements.






By forwarding the application, you will also be certifying, on behalf of the institution, that the NPI:

- is affiliated with the institution or organization;
- has the necessary time and resources to carry out the activity; and
- will notify NFRF by email (NFRF-FNFR@chairs-chaires.gc.ca) of any changes during the tenure of the grant, including changes in the composition of the partnership, such as the addition of new co-principal investigators, co-applicants or collaborators.
